Changing the Java version of Flow Management Data Hub clusters

Java 8 and 11 are installed on Cloudera Data Hub nodes in Cloudera Public Cloud by default. When you create a new cluster, Java 8 is used as the default JDK. However, it is possible to switch to Java 11 after provisioning a new cluster or after upgrading your cluster to version 7.2.17.

About this task

Procedure

1. Open the Cloudera Manager UI and click the Clusters tab in the left-hand navigation.
2. Click NiFi in the list of services to display the NiFi service page.
3. Click Configuration and update the `nifi.jdk.home` property.

Paths:

- Java 8: `/usr/lib/jvm/java`
- Java 11: `/usr/lib/jvm/java-11`


4. Repeat the same steps for the NiFi Registry service as well.

 - a) Open the NiFi UI and click the Global menu in the top right corner.
 - b) Click Cluster Versions
